

Year 1




Year 1 have had a very busy and fantastic summer term. The children have worked really hard with their phonics this year and were amazing with the phonics screening check. In English, we read 'Dadaji's Paintbrush' and had a visit from the author Rashmi Sirdeshpande. We also read 'On the way home' and learnt about the monsters/villains in different stories.

In Science, we enjoyed learning about plants, their different parts and how they grow. We observed and recorded changes over time. We also visited the Botanical Gardens and planted cress seeds and created natural art and observational drawings of Desert plants.

In History, we enjoyed learning about the Victorian Era, exploring artefacts and finding out about the history of our school. We also learnt about plastic pollution and created an Eco-sculpture of a giraffe. Thank you for joining our Sports Day, we all had an amazing time!

Eco-Sculpture Project



Rushey Mead Primary School have taken part in a collaborative Eco-sculpture project with local schools. Rushey Mead decided to collectively create a range of animals out of recyclable materials. We wanted to raise awareness of plastic pollution and look at how we can prevent this. Children learnt about how plastic can impact the planet and wildlife and the children explored ways in which they can help to reduce plastic pollution.

At Rushey Mead, we chose to make jungle animals and linked these to our Rushey Mead character traits; The curious giraffe, the ambitious rhino, the resilient lion, the respectful panda and the kind dolphin. The children loved being creative and having to problem solve to work out how to build and stick their animals together.



Year 2



In Science during the Summer term, Fir and Chestnut classes have been busy learning all about different habitats. To support their learning the children went on a visit to Twycross Zoo where they took part in a 'Habitats Workshop'. The children saw lots of different animals including rhino's, giraffe's and monkeys. Everyone had a great day out. In addition to the trip, the children have created some fantastic box models and drawings of a variety of habitats.

In Maths the children have been learning about shape, volume and fractions. They continue to work with numbers to 100 and consolidate calculation strategies. In English year 2 have been reading 'Sleeping Beauty' and lately, 'Paddington Goes to the Palace'. They have been writing postcards, letters and diaries.

All children in year 2 worked very hard and successfully completed their national SATs tests in English and Maths. Well done everyone!

Recently the whole school has celebrated French week. Year 2 tasted French food, tried dancing traditional dances and listened to Cinderella in French. It was great fun and the children are left enthused and eager to learn more about France and and learn French in year 3.











We have had a busy, fun-filled half term in Year 3. We've really enjoyed our history topic this term on Romans and especially our trip to Bosworth Battle Field to learn more about Boudicca and the Roman Army. It was great fun dressing up as Roman soldiers and Celts.

Our English work has been focussed on learning about Pompeii which all the children really enjoyed and they have written some excellent fact files and dramatic moments recounting events. They also enjoyed making Roman Mosaics in art and took a lot of care to do this.

We also enjoyed our learning about plants, especially planting sun flowers and the variety of investigations we did to learn about roots, leaves and the stem. The children have worked really hard this term and we are very proud of what they achieved.

Year 4



Year 4 have had an amazing term! They have continued to impress the entire staff team with their passion and resilience to their learning, particularly with their times tables. We had 83% of children achieve 20 or more in their multiplication check, with many achieving 25/25. They have not only done us proud but themselves too. A huge well done to you all. We'd like to also thank you for supporting your child during this process and we are already seeing the difference this has made on their maths - they are much more confident solving problems now that they know their times tables by heart!

In other news, the children have thoroughly enjoyed their PE lessons as we have had specialist coaches in to help with our cricket and athletics learning. They have also been fascinated about our Ancient Civilisations topic where we had great fun mummifying a tomato and using our Computing skills to research and learn about Egyptian Inventions. Science was another great memory of this term as we got stuck in with taking part a plug to consolidate our electricity learning. French Week and Sports Day were other exciting memories created where we were able to express ourselves and use our learning in a cross-curricular way. The children have continuously impressed us with their positive attitude to learning! We'd like to take this opportunity to thank you for all of your support this year. 

French Curriulum



Bonjour!

We've had another great year learning French - so a very big well done to all the children who have worked so hard. They have been so eager to learn and have really increased their confidence in the subject.

We ran another successful French week with our special themed menu and both the pupils and lunchtime staff did brilliantly having conversations in French. Throughout the week they had fun learning about all the different places in the world where French is spoken. Did you know it is the official language of 29 different countries and is spoken on 5 continents?

The children have been taught traditional French dances, they have played the French game - Pétanque, sang a variety of French songs, , read some French fairy tales, researched some inspirational people who come from Francophone countries, made and tasted a range of delicious French food and produced some stunning pieces of artwork in the style of famous French artists.

It would be wonderful if the children can continue to practice their French over the summer break so that they can remember what they have been taught, using Duo Lingo, YouTube videos, Oak National Academy website, French activity books etc.... 
