Attendance Matters!



At Rushey Mead Primary school we take attendance and punctuality very seriously. We aim to have an attendance figure in excess of the current **national average of 94.8%**. Attendance data is tracked by the Department for Education (DfE) and will adversely affect our Ofsted rating if it is below the required level. **Our current attendance percentage is 95.4%**, which is 0.6% greater than the national average.

Well done to all those parents and carers who ensure that their child attends schools everyday and do not take extended holidays in term time!

This is highlighted by the fact that persistent absence in school is at 15.9% which is 1.8% greater than the national average of 14.1%, which shows that there are still a significant number of children who take an extended leave of absence from school. This is something we must improve upon!

If your child is absent from school, please contact the school office EVERY day of your child's absence. Please either ring the school office and leave a message on the absence line or report your child's absence via the school gateway app.

If you do not contact the school, our Attendance Officer will ring you. Attendance is monitored on a daily basis and if your child's attendance falls below 92%, the Attendance Officer will contact you.

The school day starts at 8.40am. The school gates are open from 8.40am and close at 8.50am. If your child arrives after this time, then you MUST take you child to the office to be registered. These procedures are in place to ensure every child is accounted for in the event of an emergency and to ensure the health and safety of your child.

Extended holidays will only be granted in exceptional circumstances; it will **NOT** be granted for a family holiday!


How to apply for leave of absence for exceptional circumstances during term time.

There is no entitlement to time off in term time. Holidays will not be authorised. If a parent/carer wishes to request a day or a period of leave, they are required to write to the Headteacher and completing the appropriate leave of absence form, which is available from the school office. This must be done at least 2 weeks in advance of the date of the proposed leave. You should expect to hear from us within 5 working days. Term time holidays will NOT BE AUTHORISED unless there are exceptional circumstances which might justify it, with each case considered on its individual merits.

If a child has unauthorised leave of absence, parents/carers may either be issued with a Penalty Notice of £120 per parent/carer, per child (discounted to £60 if paid within 21 days) or the case could be referred by the Local Authority directly to the Magistrates' Court.

If the holiday request is for 20 days or more and is unauthorised, the local authority has advised that a penalty Notice is unlikely to be issued and the matter is likely to proceed to the Magistrates' Court for prosecution action instead.

For Phonics we have been learning about rhythm. We learnt to count and clap the syllables in our names and everyday objects.






For PE we have been practicing our Ball Skill – we have now developed our dribbling skills, using our feet to move with a ball.

Reception




During the Spring Term, Reception experienced online learning whilst the school continued ongoing repairs from the Autumn flood damage. Most children showed enormous resilience to the disruption and continued their learning via Teams.

Thank you to the parents and carers who helped their children during this disruption. Giving your time and support to their learning made a significant difference.

In English, Reception have enjoyed many traditional tales. The children have enjoyed 'The Gingerbread Man', 'Cinderella' & 'The Enormous Turnip'. These traditional stories give a firm foundation in understanding simple story structures. The children have also learnt to identify story characters, as well as being able to answer the question 'who is in the story?' They have started to express opinions about each character's emotions.





Phonic lessons are delivered daily. Most children are now recognising a significant number of phonic sounds and are becoming increasingly confident in blending. The children are showing us how they can use these sounds in their reading and writing. Once again, thank you to all parents who spend time reading at home. This makes a real difference to the children with their reading confidence. **Remember to return reading books on Mondays to have them changed.**

In Maths, the children are starting to recall number bonds to 10. They have been learning about addition and subtraction. They all enjoy singing many number songs and this is a great way to learn number facts.







The Importance of Healthy Packed Lunches!



If your child had a packed lunch for school, please continue to ensure that it is a healthy packed lunch as we have noticed that some children are continuously bringing into school food which is not appropriate for children to have as they continue to grow. **Children have been seen eating cold chips, burgers, pizza and other food types which are generally considered to be snacks such as crisps, biscuits and savoury Indian snacks as well as oily, fried food!**

Children in primary school are in a critical stage of growth and development. Providing them with nutritious packed lunches ensures they receive essential nutrients, vitamins, and minerals necessary for their overall health, physical growth, and cognitive development.

A balanced and healthy lunch helps maintain stable energy levels throughout the day. Nutrient-rich foods such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and lean proteins support optimal brain function, concentration, and cognitive performance, which are essential for effective learning in the classroom.



Encouraging healthy eating habits from a young age sets the foundation for lifelong wellness. By introducing children to a variety of nutritious foods early on, they are more likely to develop preferences for healthy options and make better food choices as they grow older, reducing the risk of obesity and related health issues.

Research shows a strong correlation between nutrition and academic achievement. Children who consume healthy meals are more likely to perform better academically, exhibit improved behaviour, and have higher attendance rates compared to those with poor dietary habits.

We have covered sketching in Art, states of matter and classifying in Science, and rivers and mountains in Geography, alongside Maths and Reading.


Next term, the children will be completing their Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) which covers all times tables from 2 – 12, so please continue to support at home to boost confidence and






Parallel Athletics Achievement


Year 6

In Science, they have been exploring electricity by building circuits and testing their own investigation questions, showing great curiosity and teamwork.





With the SATs beginning on Monday 12th May, we strongly recommend that the children continue revising and preparing for the tests over the Easter holidays by working through their old mock SAT papers, revisiting learning from their CGP revision booklets, reading 20-30 minutes daily, visiting Cossington Library, completing their Times Table Rock Star games and using BBC Bitesize.
